A Message from Pastor Blake...

"For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God unto salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek." (Rom. 1:16) Here the gospel refers to the promise of forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation on account of Christ Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. The Apostle Paul suffered much for the gospel. He was rejected by his fellow Jews, attacked by mobs, stoned, scourged, and at one time shipwrecked. Everyone and everything seemed to be against him. Yet in all of these he remained faithful to his calling. Why? Because Paul knew that he had been "set apart for the gospel of God, which He promised through His prophets in the holy Scriptures, concerning His Son, who was descended from David according to the flesh and was declared to be the Son of God in power according to the Spirit of holiness by His resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord..." (Romans 1:1-4)

Martin Luther and many other reformers suffered similarly for their declaration that a person is saved by trust in Christ Jesus alone apart from good works. At one time Luther was hunted by the governmental authorities in Saxony. During this time, he lived in Wartburg Castle under the false alias "Knight George." There he translated the Greek New Testament into German. Luther did doubt at times whether what he was doing was in accordance with God's will. After all, state and church opposed him. Nonetheless, during difficult times such as these, he returned to the Scriptures, where he was reminded that the gospel he proclaimed was not man's gospel but God's gospel delivered to His apostles through His Son. With this knowledge he could stand before princes and say: "Here I stand, I cannot do otherwise."

Maybe we aren't persecuted in the same way by the world because of our faith. But we are certainly attacked and persecuted by the devil and his angels. As St. Peter warns us: "Be sober minded: be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour." (1 Peter 5:8) They desire that you would fall away from the Christian faith on account of the difficulties of life let it be issues with money, health concerns, doubts concerning God and His love for you. In all these things they want you to reject the gospel as false. Yet in the midst of these trials we should run to Scripture and cling to the promises that God has given us, remember our baptisms and the gift of salvation given to us there, seek nourishment and strength for our faith in the proclamation of God's Word and the Lord's Supper given to us in the gathering of the saints. As St. Peter goes on to say: "Resist him, firm in your faith, knowing that the same kinds of suffering are being experienced by your brotherhood throughout the world. And after you have suffered a little while, the God of all grace, who has called you to His eternal glory in Christ, will Himself restore, confirm, strengthen, and establish you." (1 Pet. 5:9-10)

Peter died for the faith, crucified in Rome. Paul was beheaded in the same city, having made the good confession. Luther died at the age of 62 from health complications, never having renounced the gospel he was so bold to proclaim. These men, and many more like them throughout church history, were willing to sacrifice so much in this life while clinging to the gospel in faith, because they knew that the God who had promised them these things loved them so much that He had given His only begotten Son to die for them, and that He was faithful and able to fulfill the promise of deliverance and eternal life He had given them just as He had done for His Son by raising Him from the dead. Centuries have passed since the Reformation, and even more time has passed since the death of the Apostles, yet our conviction remains the same: "No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us." (Romans 8:37) The Triune God is your mighty


